## How to sign up

The button sits in the top right and is repeated at the bottom of the front page.

### 02 Sign up with your email

Your email address and a password you choose yourself. No payment card. Google and LinkedIn are there too, if you would rather use one of those.

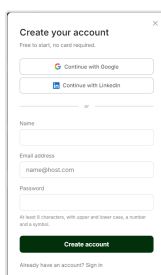
### 03 Confirm your email

We send a code to your inbox. It can take a few minutes to arrive and may land in your spam folder. The code expires after 15 minutes.

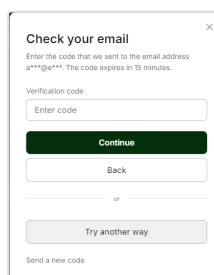
### 04 Three quick fields about your work

Name, industry, job function. The last two are drop-down lists, so it is a few clicks. Then you are in. The whole thing takes under a minute.

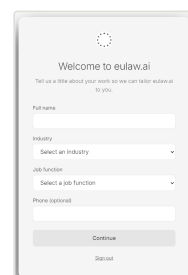

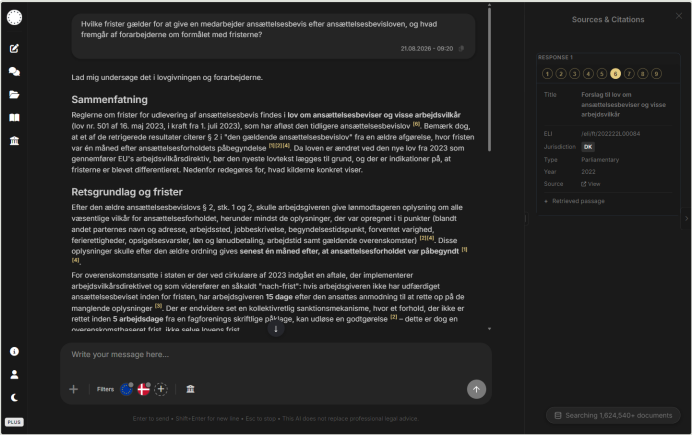

## Where you can work, and in what language

Twenty-eight further European jurisdictions are live in beta: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden and the United Kingdom. You can search up to three of them at once and compare them side by side.

Ask in any of more than 200 languages and the answer comes back in the same one, while the citation still points at the original text. A Danish question about German law is answered in Danish, and the source link goes to the German original.

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# Put your own documents in

The more of your own material eulaw.ai can read, the better the answer gets. A contract, a decision, a set of terms: it is read against the law that actually applies to it, with the same citations as everything else.

## How to upload

**01**

### Click the “+” under the text box

It sits at the bottom left of the box you type your question into.

**02**

### Choose “Upload”

Your usual file picker opens. You can pick several files at once.

**03**

### Wait for the file name to appear above the text box

A small tag with the file name means it went through; a spinning icon means it is still on its way. That tag is the confirmation, and it is the step most people miss.

**04**

### Then write your question

The document is part of the question now. You can write “check this against the Danish Sale of Goods Act” and it knows what “this” is.

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## What you can upload

PDF, Word, plain text, HTML, Markdown, Excel and CSV, plus photos and scans in JPG, PNG, GIF and WEBP. Up to 5 MB per file. If a file will not go through, save it as a PDF and try again.

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## Keep them in a library

Next to the “+” is the library icon. Documents you put in a library stay there: you can attach them to any later question without uploading them again, and eulaw.ai can search them as a source in their own right, alongside the law.

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## They stay yours

Your documents are stored and processed inside the EU only, are never used to train models, and are deleted when you delete them.
